



We find ourselves at the end of the first half term of 2024 and within this space of time, the school has already had many great successes. Just this week, we have had our Eco Council and our Reading Ambassadors meet with school leaders to identify improvements that could be made to our school. Lots of fantastic ideas have been born from these meetings and we look forward to implementing the children's ideas into shaping the future of the school.

On Thursday, 12 children from Whitmore attended University of London (SOAS) to graduate from the The Brilliant Club. The Brilliant Club is a Scholars Programme which provides Key Stage 2 pupils with an inspiring experience of university-style learning beyond the curriculum and is delivered through seven tutorials taught by a PhD tutor. This specific programme focused on the cardiovascular system and how its is affected by exercise. The children used the scientific method to identify, plan, conduct and present their research in the form of an essay and it has provided an excellent understanding for the children about what learning at university is like. Please see below for a full summary of their day.

When we return to school, we will be taking part in a challenge set by Down Syndrome UK to celebrate Work Down Syndrome Day (21st March). The challenge is based on every child in the school planting a sunflower seed and taking it home to recognise that like sunflowers, each child grows and blooms in different ways. We are very excited to take part in this challenge and will ask that parents/carers take photos of their child's sunflower and send them into school so the photos can be shared in our weekly newsletter. Please keep an eye out for the posters which will be shared shortly.

Please see below for what has been taught in phonics this week in your child/s year group:

Reception	This week has been a review week. The children have been practicing the new diagraphs and tricky words that they have learned since January.
Year 1	In phonics this week, Year 1 have been learning the following sounds: le making the /l/ sound like in apple, al making the /l/ sound like in total, c making the /s/ sound like in ice, ve making the /v/ sound like in give, o-e, o and ou making the /u/ sound like in come, mother and touch se making the /z/ sound like in cheese se and ce making the /s/ sound like in mouse and fence ey making the /ee/ sound like in donkey. We have also learnt the tricky words: school, call, different, thought, through, friend and work.



Introducing the Whitmore Eco Council, wearing their new badges proud! Our Eco Experts have been busy completing an environmental review of our school and deciding which areas we as a school need to focus on improving. They have agreed we should improve our **school grounds**, **save energy** and increase **biodiversity**.



As part of our school grounds project, we will be continuing to care for the trees, which were planted by some of our school community in November. Our energy saving project is up and running and many classes have an eco-monitor to remind their class the importance of turning off the lights when everybody is leaving the classroom, ensuring doors are closed in colder months and also keeping an eye on the paper recycling bin. Efforts have also been made towards our biodiversity goal, as Year 2 worked collaboratively to build a fantastic bug hotel on our field as part of their science lessons.

The children showed such bravery and courage when stroking animals that they were scared of to start with. They all displayed exceptional behaviour and we are so proud of them!



Year 4 Greek Day

On Friday 9th February, Year 4 had an Ancient Greek day. The children created their own fact files, made vases, retold myths and took part in food tasting. The children absolutely loved their day and are looking forward to other days like this as they move through the school.



Brilliant Club Graduation 15th February 2024

On Thursday, children from year 6 who are part of the Brilliant Club travelled to London to visit SOAS (School of Oriental and African Studies) for their graduation ceremony.

Over the last few months, the children have been working with Randy Chance, a PhD tutor from Queen Mary University, London. They have studied the human heart and learnt about different ways it can be damaged and looked after, and how exercise can affect it. At the end of their course, they had to write a 1,500 word essay about their findings. The children have learnt about how to research independently, take notes, present their findings, and cite sources. They have all worked incredibly hard and we are extremely proud of them all. Every child received a final grade of either 2:1 or a 1st; this is an amazing set of results!

On the day of the graduation, they travelled by train and underground train to SOAS. They had a session where they reflected on all they had learnt and how it would help them in the future, before working with a SOAS student ambassador to learn more about university life. They had a tour of the university, which included highlights like the library (which is a masterpiece of Brutalist architecture and has over 1.5 million books), and the Brunei Gallery, which is full of interesting art and artefacts from around the world. The children also had some delicious sandwiches for lunch, before receiving their certificates.

Throughout the day, and throughout their time on the course, the children were well-behaved and respectful. Their time as part of the Brilliant Club has allowed them to demonstrate that they are able to embody all of our core values for life. They have demonstrated friendship when they have helped each other with their essays; honesty when they have asked for help when they are stuck; perseverance when they have kept going and never given up even when they found the course difficult; positivity for having a great attitude when undertaking their challenging tasks; and, finally, respect for how they have behaved in their tutorials with Randy and on their graduation trip. All of us at Whitmore are incredibly proud of these children and hope that their time doing this has given them the confidence to believe that they can achieve anything they can set their minds to!
