KS1 & KS2—How do you think World Book Day should be celebrated? This links to the British Value —Mutual Respect and Tolerance.



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



Reception	This week Reception have been focusing on the phase 3 sounds including 'oo' like in foot, 'ur' like in fur, 'ear' like in beard and 'oi' like in coin. We have been recapping the tricky words: is, as, his, has, the, I, put, pull and full.

World Book Day 2024


Next Friday, Whitmore Primary School will be celebrating World Book Day. As part of the day, we have an author coming in to read to children in KS1.
