

#### **WW1** Aviation day

On Thursday this week, year 5 were visited by the WW1 Aviation Heritage Trust. The children learnt a lot about World War 1, including about the different planes that were used in battles and what life was like in the trenches. They also wrote poems inspired by WW1 onto special seeded paper. These will be flown over to France, where they will be dropped from a replica single-seater plane to sow poppy seeds, forget-me-not seeds and cornflower seeds in remembrance, along with poems from children in France and Germany. Finally, a VR flight simulator was set up where the children were able to fly in a plane from WW1 and operate it. There were also some souvenir prizes given out to children that our visitors thought were the best engaged in the activities. All the children were thoroughly engaged, and enjoyed their day while learning!
