





Please see below for what has been taught in phonics this week in your child/s year group:


Reception	This week Reception have been continuing to read longer words such as sunset, rocket, and farm- yard. We have been focusing on the tricky words: are, sure, pure, into, she and push.
Year 1	This week in phonics, Year 1 have been learning the following sounds: y making the /e/ sound like in happy ea making the /e/ sound like in head wh making the /w/ sound like in whisper oe and ou making the /oa/ sound like in toe and shoulder y making the /igh/ sound like in fly ow making the /igh/ sound like snow g making the /j/ sound like in giant ph making the /f/ sound like in phone We have also learnt the following tricky words: any, many, again, who, whole, where and two.
Year 2	Year 2 has revised all the following graphemes this week: or, a, aw, au, ore, oor, a,l oar, our, augh, aur, si, su, ch, tch, ture, sh, ti, ch, ssi, ci and si.
