

Please see below for what has been taught in phonics this week in your child's year group:

Reception	In phonics we have been learning words that have an -s that sounds like a -z such as visit, chairs and chains and words that have -es which sounds like -iz such as torches, fishes and wishes. The tricky words have been they, all, by, my, are, sure and pure.
Year 1	In Phonics this week, Year 1 have been growing the code: ch makes the /c/ and /sh/ sound like in school and chef ze makes the /z/ sound in freeze and sneeze We recapped the 'a' grapheme and the sounds it makes eg: /o/ in wasp, /ar/ in father, /or/ in water and /ai/ in baking.  We have also practiced reading longer words.



## **Year 5 Road Safety**

Over the last week, Year 5 children have had a visit from the Safer Essex Roads Partnership. The children have learned about how to be safe when they are out in the community, whether they are walking or on bicycles or scooters. They have learned where safe places are to cross the roads and learned about the Green Cross Code: Stop, Look, Listen, Think. They were also reminded why they should always wear a seat belt and the importance of wearing their cycle helmet. Finally, they went out with a member from Safer Essex Roads and a member of staff in small groups to practise what they have learned. Everyone has a free reflective bag to take home to help them Be safe and Be seen!
